




i-Ready from the Student Perspective


i-Ready from the Student Perspective

- The first time a student navigates to i-Ready, they will be prompted to take the diagnostic.
- They will need to select the appropriate diagnostic based on your school's schedule.

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Once students logged in, students will see this:

- For **Reading**, click on the book.
- For **Math**, click on the math signs.
- **The examiner will tell the student which diagnostic to click.**



Next, the student will see a page like this:

Students will click the **green button** to start the Diagnostic.



Next, students will:



Watch a video.



*Click on each button to watch a video about a tool. Students will then select **START TEST**.

**Students will be required to watch each video for each tool prior to beginning the diagnostic.*

Completion

At the end of the questions, you will see a “Diagnostic Complete!” screen where the student can look at their progress and what they may need to work on.

Diagnostic Complete

A congratulations screen appears to let students know they have successfully completed the Diagnostic.



The final screen of the presentation is a list of reminders.

Reminders



Students may see questions from above or below their grade level as the Diagnostic adapts.



Students may see questions in three to six Reading domains, depending on grade level and performance.



Teachers should schedule two 40–50 minute sessions for students to complete the Diagnostic.
