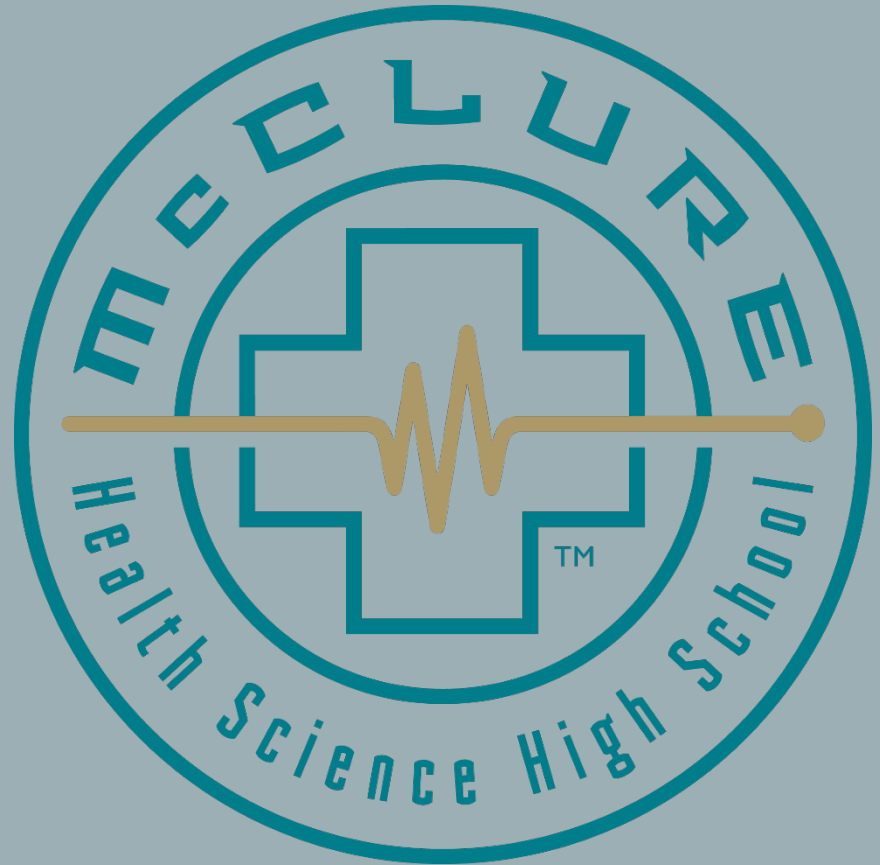

# DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

Georgia's Dual Enrollment Program provides students enrolled at an eligible public or private high school or home study program in Georgia the opportunity to earn high school and college credit at a participating eligible postsecondary institution in Georgia.

Georgia's Dual Enrollment Program offers students the opportunity to experience college courses and begin their college academic career while still in high school and provides for standard tuition, mandatory fees and required books.

The program is offered during all terms of the school year.

# WHERE CAN I ATTEND?

A student may apply to attend any participating public college, private college, or technical college in Georgia.

Most common colleges:

- Georgia Gwinnett College
- Gwinnett Technical College
- Georgia State University / Georgia Perimeter College





# WHAT ARE THE PROS AND CONS?

## PROS

- Students can get a head start on college credits.
- Helps students adjust to the college experience.
- Students may take classes not available at the high school.
- Earning college credits saves money on future college coursework—earlier graduation from college (not high school).

## CONS

- Students must keep up with important high school information.
- Many colleges prefer a different curriculum path (i.e. AP classes).
- Colleges will not communicate with parents / counselors of Dual Enrollment students.
- More appropriate for students who only plan to apply to GA colleges.

# HB 444 DUAL ENROLLMENT ACT!!

Limiting Dual Enrollment “core course work” to Juniors and Seniors.

Allowing 10<sup>th</sup> grade students to participate ONLY in CTAE area coursework.

Limiting Dual Enrollment students to a maximum of 30 hours of post-secondary coursework.

9<sup>th</sup> Grade students are NOT eligible for state funding.

# TWO OPTIONS

Traditional (formerly Option A)	Accelerated Careers (formerly Option B)
<p>Traditional dual enrollment students will complete the required credits to graduate as well as the required End of Course Assessments.</p> <p>A traditional DE student cannot take more than 15 semester or 12 quarter hours each semester (funding maximum)</p> <p>DE Funding limited to 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students (10<sup>th</sup> grade students must meet criteria)</p>	<p>Students can graduate with their high school diploma while being exempted from specific academic course requirements.</p> <p>Students must complete specific courses during their 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade year. Students choose to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and a college Associate Degree, Technical Diploma, or two (2) Technical Certificates of Credit (TCCs) in a specific career pathway. Students must work closely with their counselor and post-secondary staff to ensure they meet both the high school and college graduation requirements.</p>
<p>Some graduation requirements will be completed through dual enrollment courses. These courses may be taken on the college campus, high school campus (ENGL 1101, 1102) or online.</p>	<p>Students must take and pass the following high school courses in order to enter the AC path:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Two English courses, <b>if SB220 passes, one EOC and one state funded English course</b></li> <li>• Two mathematics courses, one being Algebra I and <b>one state funded Math course</b></li> <li>• Two science courses, <b>if SB220 passes, one EOC and one state funded Science course</b></li> <li>• Two social studies courses, one being American Gov and one Personal Finance &amp; Economics course *</li> <li>• One Health and Physical Education course</li> </ul>
<p>Traditional DE students are subject to <b>DE funding cap of 30 hours.</b></p> <p>Traditional DE students can self-pay for additional courses.</p>	<p>Accelerated Careers students <b>are not</b> subject to the funding cap. <b>Accelerated Career Education Grants—if SB 220 passes.</b></p>

# WHAT ABOUT TRANSFER CREDIT?

- It is the student's responsibility to talk with colleges regarding their policies on Dual Enrollment credit. Generally, public colleges in the state of Georgia will honor any credit earned at any other Georgia public college when a grade of "C" or higher is earned.
- Private colleges and out of state colleges vary on their acceptance of Dual Enrollment credit.

# HOW DOES GRADING WORK?

- ✓ If colleges provide the high school with letter grades, the high school will transcribe the letter grade to the midpoint of the grading scale (unless grading scale is provided).  
A = 95 B = 85 C = 75  
D = 72 or 70 F = 55
- ✓ Students may NOT drop a class without penalty!
  - ✓ Withdraw Failing (WF)
  - ✓ Withdraw Passing (WP)
- ✓ If the student fails a class, it could jeopardize graduation and future Dual Enrollment status!
- ✓ No points are added to the final grade (exception – 10 pts. are added to Georgia Tech Math, Science, Computer Science).
- ✓ All Dual Enrollment funded classes are included on the high school transcript.





## “Z” GRADES


- Any Dual Enrollment course for which GCPS receives funding (October and March FTE) will be included on the transcript.
- If the student withdraws from the course after GCPS has received funding, a “Z” score will be entered on the transcript.

**Students MUST inform their school counselor and Dr. Myers immediately if there is any college schedule change.**


**\*\*If you do not inform your school counselor and Dr. Myers of these changes, you cannot continue with Dual Enrollment the following semester.**

## CREDIT CONVERSION


► 1 – 2 semester hour college classes =  
.5 HS credit.



► 3 – 5 semester hour college classes =  
1.0 HS credit.



Note: Science labs will receive a grade, but  
NO credit on transcript. They will not count  
toward fourth science requirement.



Student's total schedule (MHSHS + College)  
must total at least 3.0 units per semester  
worth of credit.



## 6 SEGMENT MAX

- 4 DE + 0 HS = 6 segments
  - 3 DE + ? HS = 6 segments
  - 2 DE + 4 HS = 6 segments
  - 1 DE + 5 HS = 6 segments
- 
- Anything beyond the six segments will need to be self-pay.
    - Self-pay courses can be added to transcript (if on approved DE course list in GAFutures), but not in high school schedule.

## KEEP IN MIND...

- ✓ A student must meet the entrance requirements of the college.
- ✓ It is the student's responsibility to register for the correct classes.
- ✓ If a student registers for a Dual Enrollment course they previously failed, they will receive a bill from the college. Dual Enrollment will not pay for the course.
  - ✓ Students will also be required to self-pay if they have already met the 30-hour max.
- ✓ The student is responsible for ALL interaction with the college. The college will not speak with a parent or the high school counselor regarding the student.
- ✓ Students must have all schedule changes approved by their high school counselor and Dr. Myers.
- ✓ Holidays such as Spring Break will be different from the Gwinnett County holidays.

## Dual Enrollment at Gwinnett Tech



- ✓ 10<sup>th</sup> grade can take technical (CTAE) courses (2.0 GPA)
- ✓ 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade can take general education and technical courses (2.6 GPA)
- ✓ 28 general education courses guaranteed to transfer to any USG college or university
- ✓ Participate in all semesters (including mini-semesters)
  - ✓ Summer 2024: Deadline **4/24** (Reg. 3/19 – 4/30)
  - ✓ Fall 2024: Deadline **7/17** (Reg. 4/9 – 7/22)
  - ✓ Spring 2025: Deadline **12/5** (Reg. 9/17 – 12/09)
- ✓ Classes offered online or on campus
- ✓ Over 140 different programs of study

# WHO QUALIFIES FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT AT GGC

## Dual Enrollment Admission Criteria For Spring 2023, Summer 2023, and Fall 2023

- By the first day of semester at GGC:
  - must be 16 years of age
  - must be an 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade student
- Be on-track for completing all high school graduation requirements
- Be on-track for completing the USG's Required High School Curriculum (RHSC)
- Have a 3.25 High School GPA as calculated by GGC Admissions on the RHSC courses completed
- Meet GSFC's Dual Enrollment funding Program eligibility (details on GAfutures site: [gafutures.org](https://gafutures.org))

# WHO QUALIFIES FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT AT GGC

## Test Scores (Not required for admission to DE but can be submitted)

### Test Scores

- English
  - SAT Evidence Based Reading and Writing: 500
  - ACT English or Reading: 21
  - Accuplacer WritePlacer: 4 and Reading Comprehension: 237
  
  - **OR**
- Math
  - SAT Math: 510
  - ACT Math: 20
  - Accuplacer Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics: 266

Students who do not attend a regionally accredited high school or home school program are required to submit a Home School Portfolio.



# NEXT STEPS

How do I apply?

1. Create Grizzly Profile to Apply Online, Dual Enrollment Students are exempted from application fee- watch for a pop-up in your browser window
2. Review Admission Requirements
3. Submit Document Requirements
4. Meet with your high school counselor so they can begin the approval process on the high school side.

Application Deadlines: (please check GGC website for updates)

- Fall Semester – May 2
- Spring Semester – December 1
- Summer Semester – April 1

# POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

THE FOLLOWING STEPS SHOULD BE FOLLOWED  
IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO PARTICIPATE IN THE  
 DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM: 

- X\_\_1. Attend Dual Enrollment Information Meeting/View Dual Enrollment Presentation.
- \_\_2. Complete the Advisement and Contact Information Form with your school counselor.
- \_\_3. Apply to the college/university of your choice. Keep in mind that different schools have different admissions procedures. \* NOTIFY YOUR COUNSELOR WHEN YOU HAVE BEEN ACCEPTED
- \_\_4. Create a GaFutures.org account and complete an electronic Dual Enrollment Funding application and Participation Form (student/parent). One time per academic year.

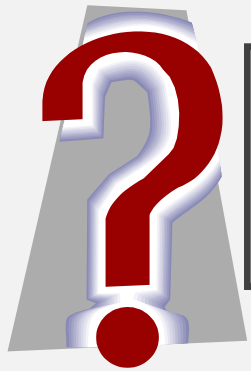
\*Repeat Each Semester of participation (excluding GTC – once per year)



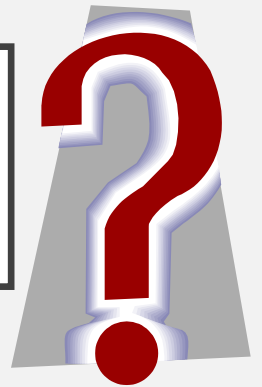
# PROCEDURES CONT.

- \_\_\_5. Speak with your college advisor and select classes. Obtain a copy of your college schedule.\*
- \_\_\_6. Provide your school counselor & Dr. Myers with a copy of your schedule. If necessary, Dr. Myers will adjust your MHSHS schedule to coincide with your college schedule.\*
- \_\_\_7. MHSHS completes the GA FUTURES funding application AFTER receiving the schedule from the student (exception: Georgia State University).
- \_\_\_8. During this process, you may get emails from the Bursar's Office indicating that payment is due---be patient and do nothing!
- \_\_\_9. At the end of the semester, provide a copy of your college/university grades and an official transcript to Mrs. Tinsley in a timely manner.

\*Repeat Each Semester of participation.
