- Goal: to assist students in their academic, social, emotional, and career development
- Mission: to create a warm, inviting, safe environment where all students feel welcomed and a sense of belonging.

Counselors meet with students in a variety of formats - individual, small group, and classroom settings. Counselors may meet with students based on student, parent, and/or teacher referrals. They also let parents know if a student's behavior presents a concern or if its just normal child behavior/development.


Welcome to Ms. Hogan's 6th Grade Book Tasting





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Students can sign up to participate in Band, Chorus, Orchestra and Guitar. All other Connections classes are randomly assigned each semester.

Students explore and experience creative expression, critical evaluation and a greater appreciation for the Visual Arts. They learn the elements and principles of design through art-making processes. These will include experiences with drawing, painting, printmaking, collage and sculpture. There will be an overview of the history of Art.

Students explore the fundamentals of programming languages and engage in hands-on projects to develop problem-solving skills. Through interactive lessons and team activities, students delve into topics such as cybersecurity and the ethical implications of technology in society.

Students explore different cultures and create choreography together. They learn dances from all over the world and mix old traditions and new styles.

Students engage in applying the Engineering Design Process to address a range of challenges, employing science, technology, engineering, and math skills. The course incorporates hands-on group activities, computer-aided design software, employability skills, lab safety, and the history of engineering and technology.

Students can participate in Band, Chorus, Orchestra and/or Guitar (up to 2 classes). These classes are a yearlong commitment. Visit the Rising 6th grade page on the JMS website to learn more about these programs and to sign up.

Students learn about the importance of maintaining physical and mental well-being through topics, such as mental/emotional health, nutrition/physical activity, injury/violence prevention, and alcohol/drugs. The purpose is to empower students with essential knowledge for leading healthy and fulfilling lives.

Students dive into music technology, making their own music videos and sounds for video games. They discover how music and technology combine and focus on being creative while learning more about music.

Physical Education is a class where students get up and moving through a variety of team games and fitness assessments. Fit for a lifetime cannot be achieved unless there is some FUN involved.

Spanish Connections is offered as a semester long course in 6th grade. Students learn the basics of the Spanish language as well as culture and history. Students in the DLI program are automatically registered for DLI Connections courses. 7th and 8th grade students have the opportunity to be invited to take the Spanish I high school level course.


Instructional Framework

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• As part of the Seckinger cluster, students will continue their experiences with AI & Future Readiness Skills. • These skills are built into all classes and content areas.








Promotion Criteria


- Students must pass 5 out of 6 classes with an average of 70 (1st semester and 2nd semester) in order to be promoted to 7th grade

During Open House, students and parents will tour the school, receive transportation information, meet teachers, become familiar with the curriculum, and navigate eCLASS.


