REQUIRED READING ASSIGNMENT

All 10th grade Language Arts students will be required to <u>**READ AND ANNOTATE**</u>** both selections listed below by the first day of school. <u>All students should bring the annotated copies to class on the first day of</u> <u>school as part of the summer reading assignment grade</u>. PDFs are linked below.

- 1. <u>"The Danger of A Single Story"</u> (2009). Speech by Chimamanda Adichie
 - a. A minimum 10 high-quality annotations*
- 2. <u>"Mother Tongue"</u> (1990). Short Story by Amy Tan
 - a. At least 10 high-quality annotations*

* <u>High Quality Annotations are NOTES</u> (not just highlights/underlines) on the text that show

RECOMMENDED READING

Beyond the classroom, reading is a valuable life skill that also has social-emotional benefits, including stress relief. In addition to the required assignment above, we've put together a list of recommended summer books that 10th grade teachers love to give you some inspiration for reading. <u>These books are some of our favorites, but they are simply suggestions.</u> Find a book or two and dive in! - **The Pearl by John Steinbeck** (1947). A short novella about the dangers and evils of greed, set in southern California and Mexico.
- **The Devil in the White City by Erik Larson** (2003). A historical non-fiction book detailing the architectural endeavors required to bring the 1893 World's Fair to Chicago. Oh, and also, America's first serial killer, H.H. Holmes, is a central figure in the book, killing people and cremating them in a hotel basement.
- A Thousand Splendid Suns (2007) by Khaled Hosseini. Set in Afghanistan from the early 1960s to the early 2000s, the story follows two women with intertwining stories who meet and become a family in an unexpected way. This book pulls you in and has you cheering for the characters to overcome their circumstances throughout.
- In the Time of the Butterflies (1994) by Julia Alvarez. A work of historical fiction based on the lives of the four Mirabal sisters, who participated in underground efforts to topple Rafael Leonidas Trujillo's three-decade-long dictatorial regime in the Dominican Republic.
- *I Am Not Your Perfect Mexican Daughter* (2017) by Erika Sanchez. A poignant but often laugh-outloud funny contemporary YA about losing a sister and finding yourself amid the pressures, expectations, and stereotypes of growing up in a Mexican-American home.
