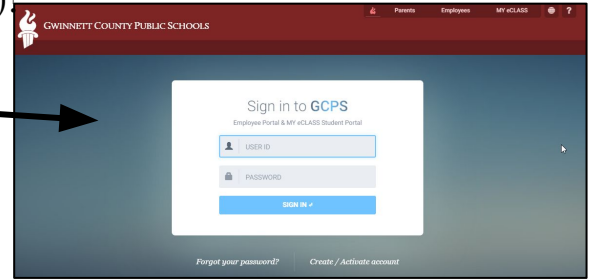


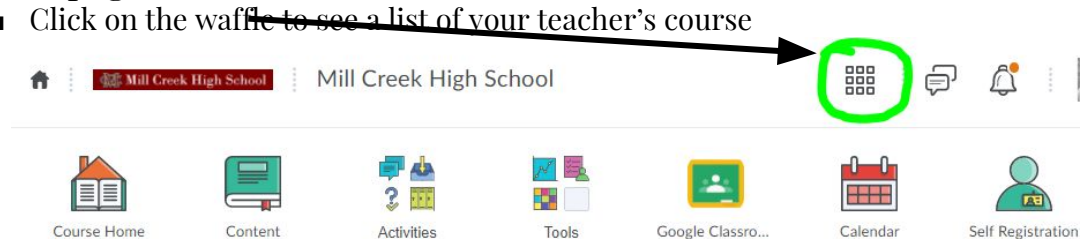
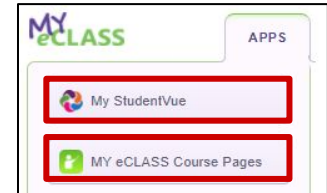
# NEW STUDENTS - eCLASS, GOOGLE, AND ZOOM

- I'm new to GCPS, how do I get started?
  - What is My eCLASS (Student Portal)?

Go to [www.gcpsk12.org](http://www.gcpsk12.org) to log into the student portal. eClass is where you access schedule, grades, course pages, & other digital resources.



- Where can I see my schedule & grades?
  - Click on “My StudentVue” to see grades, assignments, class schedule and more
- Where can I see my teacher’s eCLASS course pages?
  - Click on the waffle to see a list of your teacher’s course



## • What is G Suite?

- A suite of web applications created by Google for educational use. Your GCPS G Suite account includes a secure domain for the following:
  - Drive , Docs, Sheets, Slides, & other connected apps
  - Gmail - our domain is restricted so that students can email teachers at their @gcpsk12.org accounts and other GCPS G Suite Domain accounts, but they cannot send/receive emails from outside the domain to help protect our students and provide a secure digital environment.

## ◦ What is my G Suite Account?

- Student G Suite accounts: `firstname.lastname####@gcpsk12.org`
- Numbers are the last four digits of the Student ID #
  - Accounts use the registered First and Last Name
    - Double last names are included with no spaces, hyphenated last names include the hyphen.
- Troubleshooting: If your teacher has posted Google resources and you are receiving a “restricted” error message, please make sure you are signed in to the chrome browser with your GCPS G Suite account.
