What levels are there, and what will I learn?

Level 1

Level one is ideal for students who do not have prior knowledge of the language. Here, students learn basic speaking, reading, writing, and comprehension skills, as well as cultural knowledge of various countries where the language is spoken.

Level 2

Level two builds on the foundations learned in level one and further develops students' abilities to interact in more complex situations, speak more effectively, and write more extended passages. Cultural understanding is also further explored.

Level 3

Level three focuses on strengthening students' ability to communicate orally and textually on a wider range of topics. They will read authentic texts and handle more challenging situations as well as make cultural comparisons among many different societies.

Level 4

Level four is taught almost exclusively in the target language and covers topics such as history, literature, culture, and current events. Through their coursework, students will continue to refine their communicative abilities and understanding of the culture.

Advanced Placement

Currently, Spanish is the only language offering an AP course. In this class, students will develop speaking, reading, writing, and listening skills as well as continue the study of Hispanic and Latin cultures. This class is conducted in Spanish.
