Students in the Norcross Cluster have the unique opportunity to request the high school they wish to attend, either Norcross High School or Paul Duke STEM. We have found that students and families make the best request for their student by learning about both high schools and requesting the school that best fits a student's interests. To help families with their request, there are opportunities over the next few weeks for student and parents to learn more about both Norcross High School and Paul Duke STEM High School.

Students and parents can begin familiarizing themselves with both schools by visiting both of the school's websites at PaulDukeSTEM.org and NorcrossHigh.org. Families will submit their high school preference in early December, after the Thanksgiving break.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: The high school decision is a commitment until the student graduates. After the school preference submission process, families will not be able to change their school preference.
