- Good Samaritan Health Center is not a free clinic but does provide comprehensive primary healthcare on a low cost flat fee basis, including: Family primary care, Counseling, Patient Education, Laboratory and Imaging referrals.
- Depending on the reason for the medical visit, fees range from \$25 to \$75. Depending on the medical condition, laboratory or other diagnostic services may be required which could cost more. Fees are available for review at the Center.
- Primarily, the clinic serves adults but also offers limited services to pediatric patients.

- The clinic only treats uninsured Gwinnett County residents who qualify with our financial guidelines. All prospective patients must have a qualifying appointment.
- Annual Updates are necessary to maintain eligibility.
- Patients who wish to receive services must:
 - Meet household income qualifying requirements.
 - Be a Gwinnett County resident.
 - Have no insurance, including Medicare or Medicaid.
 - Patients who have a qualification appointment MUST bring the necessary documents (specific information on website).
 - Must be under the age of 65.

- Hope Clinic is not a free clinic; however they do offer reduced fees to uninsured patients. Fees are charged to patients on a sliding scale that is based on their annual household income. The Hope Clinic provides medical care at rates that are 30 to 60 percent less than the actual cost of services.
- The Clinic accepts two types of payment: (1) Self Pay—for patients who are uninsured or who do not want insurance filed, (2) Medicare (NOT Medicaid).
- The Clinic charges reduced fees for uninsured and cash paying patients. If you elect to self-pay and would like to be considered for the sliding scale, please bring one of the following documents to each visit: Current pay stub, Most recent W-2 Form, Statement from employer verifying income, Shelter letter, Treatment program letter, Letter from caseworker, Letter from church or other health center.
